



EDIBLE FOREST GARDENS:

Practical Theory, Techniques, and Design

Despite a number of recent food forest initiatives globally there remain relatively few examples and resources, particularly in a North American context, on how to establish edible forest gardens and why they may be favoured over conventional gardening techniques.

In this presentation, the concept of edible forest gardens is discussed by exploring some of the basic ecological principles they are based on and why they are considered a sustainable gardening approach. We also explore some examples of how they have been established elsewhere and historically, and some potential techniques and designs that can be used as models to establish your own small-scale edible forest garden at home or in your community.

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
